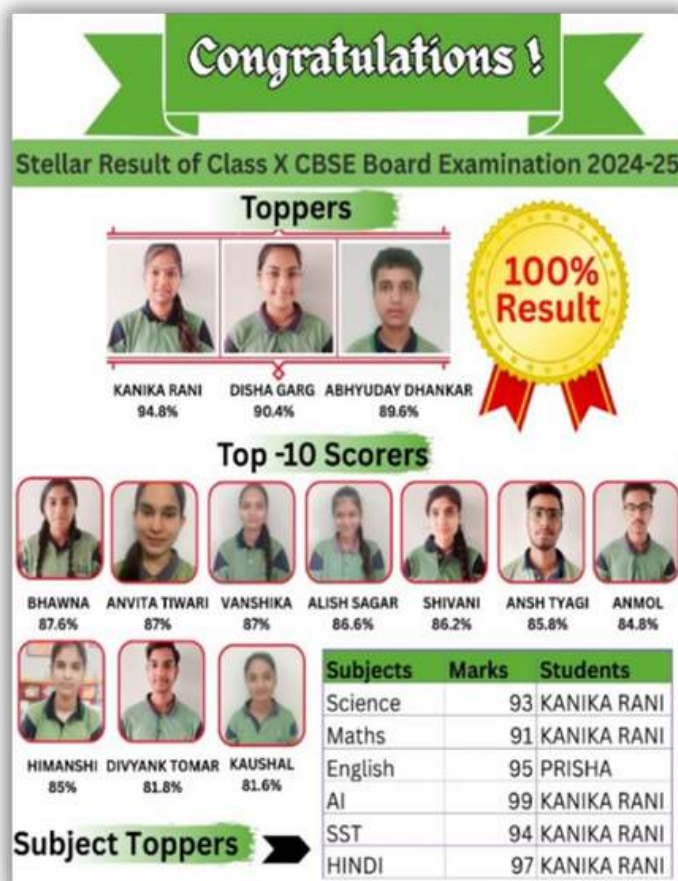

MOBIUS YOUNG CLIMATE LEADERS FOR HIMALAYAN DEVELOPMENT

In May 2025, the **Nagaland team of Mobius Young Development Professionals** embarked on an insightful visit to the North Eastern states, engaging with key stakeholders including NGO heads, newly appointed **State coordinators** and **Mobius Young Professionals**. The goal of the visit was to orient these stakeholders about the project's objectives and its effective implementation, while also setting clear expectations for targets and outcomes.

The team shared valuable insights about Mobius Foundation, outlined the vision for the project, and provided comprehensive guidelines to ensure the seamless adoption of all activities. The discussions focused on fostering collaboration and ensuring the project's success at the grassroots level.

As part of the **Mobius Green Friday** initiative, the team also distributed **segregated waste bins** to schools that participated in the program last year. These bins are designed to collect segregated paper and plastic waste, which students bring from home and deposit every Friday.

This effort aims to promote sustainability and raise awareness about waste management among young learners.

UMEED 1.0

Health Mela – 29th May, 2025: at the **Gram Panchayat Puraini Jarwal**, attracting a total of **448 participants** - 365 adults and 83 adolescents. The event provided a wide array of health services, including family planning support for 53 individuals, issuance of over 30 Ayushman Bharat cards, distribution of 77 sanitary pad kit, and health check-ups for 104 attendees. The Mela saw enthusiastic involvement from District officials, Bharat Scouts, RBSK teams, Gram Panchayat representatives, and local community members, contributing to the success of the initiative.

UMEED 2.0

Mobius Team Visit at the Community Health Centre (CHC) in Chhapaiya, Gonda District – 20th May, 2025: as part of the ongoing review of family planning services. The visiting team included Dr. Ram Boojh, Ms. Pooja Prasad, Ms. Banajyotsna Baruah, Dr. Bhagyashree Keserwani and Mr. Prabhat Kumar, along with representatives from the PFI state and district teams.

During the visit, the team met with Dr. Amit Kumar, Chief Medical Superintendent, and engaged in detailed discussions with ASHAs, ANMs, field staff, and beneficiaries. The objective was to assess progress, understand challenges, and observe community engagement around family planning services.

KEY OBSERVATIONS FROM THE VISIT:

- An innovative "**Family Planning Box**" was introduced, stocked with oral contraceptive pills and condoms to improve accessibility for clients.
- The box features a QR code that, when scanned, offers guidance on proper usage—serving as a practical and user-friendly resource.

- A coupon-based referral system has been implemented, linking eligible couples from OPD to the Umeed Counselling Centre for further guidance.
- Conversations with ASHAs and ANMs provided valuable insights into grassroots mobilization and highlighted ongoing challenges in reaching and engaging eligible couples.
- The Umeed Counselling Corner is fully functional, with community health workers actively involved in outreach, counselling, and the delivery of family planning services. The space is effectively utilized to counsel women and couples on various contraceptive options.

AAKAR JANANI: SIDDHARTH NAGAR

In line with the rising summer temperatures, the team strategically prioritized field engagement over Fixed Day Services (FDS), placing a strong focus on counselling newlyweds and eligible couples about both temporary and permanent family planning options.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS:

- **Fixed Day Services (FDS):** Five FDS sessions were conducted through COT, delivering a total of 23 family planning services. These included 1 NSV (Non-Scalpel Vasectomy), 14 female sterilizations—primarily Minilap procedures efficiently led by Dr. P. Kanaujia—and 8 IUCD insertions.
- **Community Engagement:** The team actively participated in 13 cluster meetings held across various CHCs, directly engaging 289 community members in discussions on reproductive health and family planning.
- **Community Mobilization:** A total of 64 Village Health, Sanitation, and Nutrition Day (VHSND) sessions were conducted, reaching 720 individuals. These efforts were complemented by counselling at Family Planning Counselling Centres (FPCCs), where 33 beneficiaries received personalized guidance.
- **Contraceptive Distribution:** As part of ongoing demand generation, 25 individuals were provided with a total of 72 cycles of oral contraceptive pills (OCPs), while 10 individuals received 205 condoms.

GYAN KANYA SHAKTI: 100 SCHOOL PROGRAM

MADHYA PRADESH

- **Expansion – Phase III:** Permissions have been secured for the third phase of the GKS initiative, with **10 government girls' schools** adopted across the districts of Umariya and Shahdol. Classes for Grade 6 are scheduled to commence in July 2025. Necessary approvals have been received from the respective District Collectors, enabling smooth implementation in the new locations.

- **Recruitment of New District Coordinators:** The hiring process for two District Coordinators commenced in May 2025. The selected candidates will assume their respective roles at designated locations starting from 16th June, 2025.
- **Planning for Academic Year 2025–26:** Internal planning sessions and coordination meetings with partner organizations were conducted to prepare for the upcoming academic year. The initiative in Madhya Pradesh will now **expand its operations to 25 schools across six districts: Sheopur, Panna, Satna, Sidhi, Umaria and Shahdol.**
- **GKS App Data Maintenance:** District Coordinators and Ayojikas undertook comprehensive data collection from all participating schools, including academic results and student details. The collected data was uploaded to the GKS mobile application, which is currently under development and expected to be fully operational soon.

UTTAR PRADESH

- **Commencement of New Academic Session in Partnership with Lotus Petal Foundation (LPF):** Students have actively engaged in their respective courses, marking a positive and seamless start to another year of learning and growth.
- **Completion of MiVirtue Life Skills Education (LSE) Sessions:** These sessions played a vital role in fostering the emotional, social, and ethical development of students through interactive and participatory learning methods.
- **Research Study on GKS – Chitrakoot Field Visit:** The impact assessment study aims to evaluate the program's effect on girls' education, health and the overall learning environment in rural areas. Data was collected from selected schools to generate evidence-based insights that will inform future strategy and potential scale-up.

- **HPV (Human Papillomavirus) Vaccination Drive led by District Magistrate – Chitrakoot:** aimed to promote preventive healthcare and raise awareness among adolescent girls, contributing to broader health and wellness goals.
- **Field Visit by Ms. Poonam Parihar - Jhansi Division (Jhansi, Jalaun and Chitrakoot) – 21st – 25th May, 2025:** focused on preparations for the next phase of the initiative. Key activities included meetings with education officials, infrastructure assessments, a review of the Grade 9 pilot in Chitrakoot, and identification of on-ground support needs.

BIOGAS/COMPRESSED BIOGAS (CBG) PROJECT

Field Visit – 14th May, 2025: Mr. Abhishek Patel, Project Manager, Mobius Foundation, recently conducted a field visit to the **Sakhi MPC operational area in Alwar, Rajasthan**, to review the on-ground implementation of the household biogas project. The visit aimed to assess both the progress of plant installations and the effectiveness of project branding. As part of the initiative, **200 household biogas plants** have already been **successfully installed**, bringing sustainable energy solutions to rural communities. Each plant features a sticker with the Mobius logo, acknowledging the organization's support and commitment to clean energy and community empowerment.

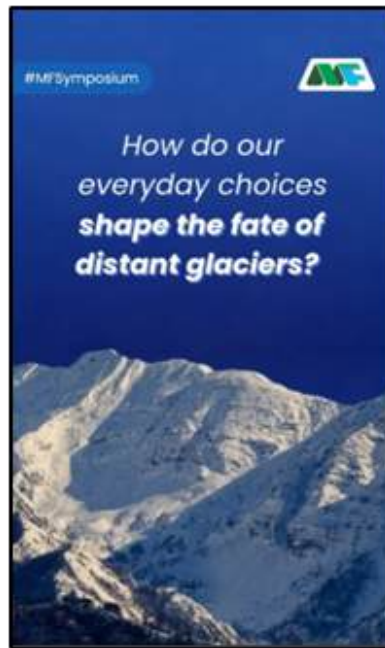

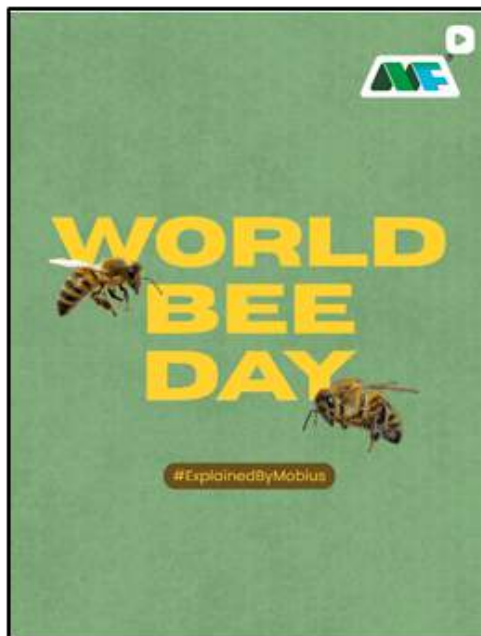
