Enabling Youth Leaders for a Sustainable Future



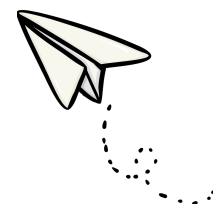

Gyan Kanya Shakti (GKS): 100 Schools Program



UTTAR PRADESH

Vidya Sahyog - Academic Support & Digital Learning

Between January and March, the **GKS program** integrated core subject support with a strategic focus on exam preparation. Reaching over **1,800 students**, the quarter saw the delivery of **2,377 digital classes**. By pivoting from standard lessons to interactive revision and practice papers, the initiative has significantly strengthened learning outcomes for girls in Grades 6–10, fostering a culture of academic excellence and readiness.

Healthy Bodies, Confident Minds: Two major health interventions defined this quarter's success:

- **483 Girls Screened:** In partnership with the **RBSK team**, comprehensive health and eye screenings were conducted, including anaemia and vision assessments, with provision of iron supplements and necessary medicines to ensure early identification and timely management of health concerns.
- **1,900+ Girls Empowered:** The "**Mahine Ke Wo Paanch Din**" initiative combined sanitary pad distribution with **Menstrupedia comics** to promote informed hygiene. This proactive approach to reducing stigma has received strong validation from both school authorities and the regional press.

Programme Review & Monitoring: Leadership undertook multiple field visits—ranging from Lucknow for institutional MoU renewal to key districts for school-level assessments and liaison with government officials. These visits, combined with ongoing academic monitoring during examinations, helped bridge the gap between policy and classroom implementation, ensuring seamless and effective programme delivery.

Additionally, GKS initiatives in education and health for rural girls received media visibility through PR coverage in newspapers, further strengthening awareness and outreach of the programme.

Mahine ke Wo Paanch Din Initiative

MADHYA PRADESH

Academics:



Gyan Kanya Shakti online classes' course has been completed at all the schools for all grades. Revision classes were conducted in January to better prepare students for the planned End Term Exams from 2nd February 2026. Endline exams were conducted across 25 schools for Academic Session 2025-26. Over 2000 students appeared for the exams in English, Maths and Science. The results of the exams will be shared by early next month.

Healthcare:

Health camps were conducted at schools in Shahdol. A total of 64 students were screened, out of which no students require specs. Families of students with major health issues have been informed and updated. 18 spectacles were distributed to students in Umaria schools. These specs will help the girls in improvement of their vision and also ensure their increased engagement at school, during classes.

Operations:

A two-day field visit was made to Sheopur and a three-day field visit was made to Umaria and Shahdol by Ms. Jessica Gill, Program Lead and Ms. Neha Chaudhary, Program Coordinator, in January and February 2026. Meeting was done with Mr. Arpit Verma, District Magistrate, Sheopur, to explain him about the Gyan Kanya Shakti initiatives at the schools. Vists to GGHSS, Sheopur and SKSP, Karhal were also made to meet the Principals and teachers. Meetings were held with school Principals and teachers to discuss interventions under Gyan Kanya Shakti. Positive feedbacks from students and teachers was received at all the schools.

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All District Coordinators completed two online training courses in MS Word and MS Excel. These courses will help them in performing their tasks effectively and efficiently. A new attendance marking system has been introduced to the Districts Coordinators and Ayojikas. This new system is more user friendly, which will result in real time data management and issues resolution.

Disaster Management Workshop at Panna:

A three-day Disaster Management Workshop was conducted by Zila Panchayat, Panna. Mr. Aasheesh S. Kshatriya, District Coordinator, Panna, attended the workshop on behalf of Mobius Foundation. He then shared his learnings at GKS schools, amongst the students and teachers, to inform them about the right practices.

Planning & Execution Meeting with Stakeholders:

District Coordinators conducted meeting with LPCF team to plan the timetable for academic session 2026-27. They then conducted meetings with all the principals at all the schools in their respective schools to better plan the session. The Ayojikas were also directed about the same for smooth execution of the program.

Mobius Young Climate Leaders for Himalayan Development (MYCL)

Youth-led environmental initiative empowering future climate leaders across North-east India

Assam:

Environmental education initiatives progressed through school programmes, capacity-building efforts, and a monitoring visit in Guwahati. Activities under the Pani-Pahar curriculum, the Nature Learning-cum-Biodiversity Documentation programme, and World Wetlands Day engaged students in experiential, observation-based learning, including documenting campus biodiversity and understanding ecological linkages. A Monitoring & Evaluation visit on 24–25 March 2026 reviewed implementation across four schools, reaching over 100 students, and included engagement with key partners such as Aaranyak and ASTEC. The visit highlighted improved student awareness, participation, and sustainable behaviours, alongside enhanced facilitation skills among Mobius Young Professionals.



Nature-learning-cum-Biodiversity Documentation program

Meghalaya:

The programme focused on strengthening waste management efforts through planning, community engagement, and research in Tura, West Garo Hills. Activities included a cleaning drive at Chandmari and an awareness programme on waste segregation, anti-littering measures, and the ban on single-use plastics in collaboration with the Tura Municipal Board. Simultaneously, data collection from 35 respondents supported the Research and Development component.



Awareness program

Mizoram:

Activities focused on documenting Indigenous Traditional Knowledge on climate change across Lunglei, Champhai, and Saitual, alongside community engagement and awareness initiatives. A drawing and painting competition across 16 schools and an awareness session at Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy, attended by around 50 students, promoted environmental awareness. Additionally, an awareness programme on Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) was conducted for Mobius Young Professionals in February. Waste management efforts included a cleaning drive at the Huhliap Training Centre, where approximately 30 kg of waste was collected and safely disposed of at a municipal site.



Awareness program on Environment & Climate Change

Sikkim:

Efforts focused on capacity building, research, and school-based environmental education. Two research papers were successfully submitted, while farmers in the Yuksam–Tashiding constituency received greenhouse materials to support climate-resilient, off-season cultivation, improving productivity and incomes. Mobius Young Professionals conducted the 4th Pani Pahar session and introduced a ‘Promise Corner’ in schools, engaging students through eco-decoration and drawing activities promoting water conservation. Phase One of the Pani Pahar Curriculum was completed in March, followed by a two-day exposure visit involving 4–5 students and a teacher from each school to Rabdentse Bird Park and Yamthang Bird Farm, with a stay in Yaksam to encourage shared learning.

Tripura:

Pani Pahar curriculum was expanded across schools in Charilam Block, with Mobius Young Professionals delivering interactive sessions on water conservation, completing final modules, and collecting feedback from students and school heads. A key highlight was the Poshan Mela, where 16 schools showcased kitchen gardens to promote nutrition, experiential learning, and community participation. Efforts also advanced through engagement with the Tripura Biodiversity Board and field surveys at Sepahijala Wildlife Sanctuary to assess climate-resilient conservation needs. Capacity-building initiatives further strengthened skills in sustainable resource management through hands-on training in bamboo products, medicinal plants, and rural livelihood development, alongside community engagement in Ambassa exploring sustainable livelihood models with a local self-help group.

Student Achievements and Engagement:

Students excelled in Olympiads, securing 2 Gold medals in English, 1 in General Knowledge, 13 in Mathematics, and 8 Gold, 6 Silver, and 8 Bronze in Hindi, with Ansh Tyagi and Vireen Rawat qualifying for the State-Level round of the Polaris Innov-a-thon. This momentum continued with a student exhibition, where Classes VI–XI showcased innovative projects on renewable energy, robotics, environment, and space; the event was inaugurated by international basketball player Mr. Prince Tyagi, and winners received certificates and trophies.

Sports Achievements and Events:

The Annual Sports Meet saw enthusiastic participation with a march past, races, and games, celebrating sportsmanship across classes. Students also excelled at the Open National Athletic Event organized by the Youth Games Council of India, with Ayush Tomar winning Gold in the 100m and 800m races, Kavish securing Gold in the 800m, and Deepanshu Prajapati winning Gold in Yoga, qualifying for the International Athletes Event in Nepal. The school further hosted an Inter-School Under-14 Basketball Championship, where the Girls’ team secured the Runner-up position.

Embers of Hope: The Fight For Our Future

Building on its call to action, the initiative invites students, institutions, NGOs, researchers, and individuals to share impactful sustainability stories across themes such as climate change, biodiversity, water, waste, and urban sustainability. Submissions should outline the problem, approach, impact, and learnings, with shortlisted entries gaining visibility among experts, policymakers, and partners.

Shaping Population, Strengthening Communities, Sustaining the Future.

Aakar “Umeed” - Driving Population stabilisation

The Umeed Project strengthened family planning through expanded outreach, service delivery, and convergence across districts. The SBCC campaign “Itni Bhi Kya Jaldi Hai?” was launched in Balrampur, with a mobile van outreach planned across 150 villages. Health fairs in Gonda and Bahraich reached over 1,800 beneficiaries, while a Mega Health Fair in Jarwal (Bahraich) registered 754 beneficiaries (722 adults, 32 adolescents), delivering 350 OPD consultations, 240 health check-ups, 42 adolescent screenings, counselling

for 43 men, and family planning services for 50 beneficiaries, along with issuance of 33 Ayushman Bharat cards. District Working Group (DWG) meetings across multiple districts reviewed progress, focusing on FPCC performance, ELA targets, contraceptive access, and male participation, while identifying gaps such as low NSV uptake and shortage of trained surgeons. Recognition of frontline workers across Barabanki, Gonda, Unnao, Sitapur, and Bahraich reinforced accountability. Field engagement and Mobius team visits further highlighted improved counselling services, strengthened ASHA capacity, and effective district-level implementation.

Enhancing Access to Family Planning in Siddharth Nagar, Uttar Pradesh: A Partnership with Janani

In Siddharth Nagar, Uttar Pradesh, the Aakar–Janani programme demonstrated strong progress through sustained service delivery and community engagement. The programme crossed 300 sterilizations for the first time this year, with 18 service camps across multiple blocks resulting in 308 female sterilizations and 1 NSV.

Additional family planning camps contributed 240 female sterilizations, with high participation from Jogiya, Lotan, and Bhanwapur. Continued efforts through FPCC counselling, CHC cluster meetings, and VHSND sessions supported community mobilization, with 36 VHSND sessions reaching 339 beneficiaries and 17 FPCC sessions covering 207 clients. A further 103 female sterilizations were recorded during the month, reflecting strong acceptance of permanent methods, while ongoing outreach and planned FDS camps aim to sustain and strengthen programme momentum

Impact of Awareness Activity - Saran, Bihar

The Aakar programme strengthened family planning awareness and service uptake through counselling, community outreach, and field engagement. A total of 225 eligible couples were counselled across 11 sessions, while awareness activities reached 60 villages through mobile van campaigns, IEC distribution, and audio-visual messaging. Capacity-building efforts included 10 meetings with 157 ASHA workers and facilitators. Additional outreach through cluster meetings, VHSND sessions, canopy activities, and branded van campaigns further promoted access to free family planning services, contributing to CHC

Dighwara receiving first prize for female sterilization in the district. A field visit reviewed programme implementation across blocks, including PHC Nagra and FDS/COT services, alongside engagements with key stakeholders. During the Stabilization Fortnight (6–20 March), intensified activities led to 174 sterilizations (173 female, 1 NSV), reflecting continued impact.

Mobius Foundation celebrated the International Women’s Day, bringing together the team to honour and recognize the contributions of women. Aligned with this year’s theme, “Give to Gain,” the celebration highlighted the importance of generosity, support, and collaboration in building inclusive and empowering spaces. Staff marked the occasion by wearing shades of purple, white, and green—symbolizing justice and dignity, hope, and purity—adding a vibrant and meaningful spirit to the event.

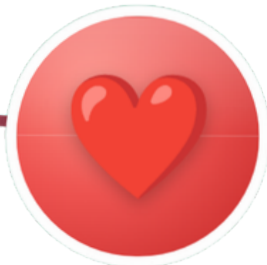

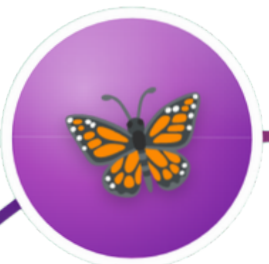

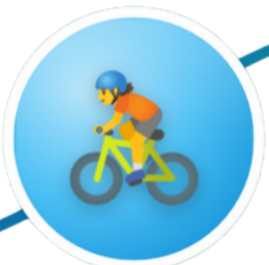
